### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

As a member of the Board of Directors of Mackay Community Foundation and chair, it is with pleasure that I present the 2017/2018 Annual Report.

The report highlights how the Foundations ideals work for the Mackay community, growing a corpus of funds that ensure we can provide ongoing support to local organisations that do so much good work in our community assisting people in need or experiencing disadvantage.

Apolitical, we are a philanthropic charity founded in 2003 run by a volunteer board of directors who, over these 15 years, have grown the corpus to currently hold invested donations on the Mackay community's behalf of over \$1.4M, the returns on which are donated through grants each year.

We continue to seek donations from all members of our community to invest so that the returns on that growing corpus will always be available. It is always a pleasant surprise to me to see the level of support that the Foundation receives and the generosity of the people of Mackay. In what has been a difficult time for the economy people still maintain a philanthropic attitude which says a lot about us as a community.

Mackay Community Foundation can achieve meaningful change through leverage of our Social, Moral, Intellectual, Reputational as well as Financial (SMIRF) capital, building networks and connections to foster a sense of belonging, reflecting and protecting community values, leveraging deep local knowledge, and using our position as trusted local leaders to empower and support our community. Through the work of our board of directors, the generosity of the community and the hard work of those organisations that impact people's lives every day we are achieving that change. There is always more we can do, and that is the challenge for us as a board moving forward, ensuring that we evolve the Foundation wherever possible and grow the corpus.

To that end we will launch Vital Signs for the Mackay community. We are very proud to be one of only a handful of Community Foundations in Australia that have undertaken this initiative and we look forward to the conversations that Vital Signs will start in our community and how the community can help overcome the challenges that face us.

I would like to thank my fellow board members for their ongoing commitment to the Foundation and its vision. To departing directors Ben Chick, Col Meng, Dorne Wallace, Jordan Miller and Nic Willis, who all provided so much to the board, we thank them for their contribution. In this world where commitments from careers, business and other organisations make contributing to a board like Mackay Community Foundation difficult, we thank all these people for providing their time.

The goal of the Foundation is to hold \$10 million dollars in corpus by 2040. This would allow us to provide over \$500,000 support every year to the Mackay community. This sounds a daunting figure, but with the help of the entire community I strongly believe we can achieve this and more.

A gift to the Foundation is a gift that keeps giving forever, so please, Give Where You Live.

### **OUR HISTORY**

The concept for The Mackay Community Foundation began with our founder Scott Alman in 2002. Scott, a partner in a local investment advisory firm was discussing the story below and thought about the impact on those in need if someone had put away some money for Mackay 100 years ago.

In 1626, Peter Minuit purchased Manhattan Island from the Algonquin tribe of Indians for trinkets worth about \$24. Given the price of real estate in Manhattan today, we could argue that the Indians were swindled. However, let's assume that the Indians invested the \$24 in a bank account returning 6% per year compounded annually. In 2005 after 379 years the investment would be worth \$66 Billion

The key founding principal was to give the Mackay Community the opportunity to 'Give Where You Live'. Secondly that money donated would be invested, and together with the growth, the capital would be retained in perpetuity. Each year the growing income is to be given away to community groups, and projects, to assist those in need in our community.

Scott then set about inspiring other key business and community leaders to join the board of the foundation. The founding board members were; Solicitor Andrew Coates, Accountant Wayne James and Financial Planner Stephen Lowry, with Scott Alman as the chair. Since the beginning the sitting Mayor of Mackay has also held a position on the board.



### AT A GLANCE

Since our establishment in 2003 we have distributed 67 grants to local community groups and charities. The Mackay Community Foundation is a member of Australian Community Philanthropy and is one of approximately 40 community foundations across Australia, linked by similar values, ethics and intent and each playing a vital role in their own community, providing grassroots support at a local level.

The Mackay Community Foundation provides support to local community groups and charities in the Mackay region which is an area encompassing a population of approximately 100,000 people.

The Mackay Community Foundation managed the 2008 Mackay Flood Appeal, upon request of the then Mackay City Council, raising \$564,566.13 that was distributed directly to Mackay people impacted by this natural disaster.

The Mackay Community Foundation works extremely hard to ensure administrative expenses are kept to a minimum and where possible source donated services and support. Fifteen percent of each dollar donated to the Foundation is directed to the administration account to assist with the costs associated with enabling the Foundation to deliver its mission:

### GRANTS COMMITTEE REPORT 2017-2018

In keeping with current Gifting priorities, Mackay Community Foundation has again funded more substantial projects that have a longer-term focus and benefit for the Mackay Community. There was only 1 grant round offered in March- April inviting applications for projects in the \$10,000-\$30,000 range to allow an organisation to look at actual program development, capacity building and innovative approaches to bring about social change and positive impact for those experiencing disadvantage.

The MCF Grants program provides funds to help, aid, provide relief or support persons in distress in Mackay and surrounding districts. We do this by working with eligible organisations that primarily offer community education, care services, housing or personal support services, through a grant application process. In 2017- 2018, MCF provided a total of \$72,500 to organisations who come from the Mental Health, Aged and Disability, Community Development, Women's Services, Youth and general community support sectors.





### GRANTS

### **ANGLICARE NTH QLD (MACKAY)**

Anglicare Nth Qld, Mackay branch, provides without discrimination, a range of affordable and accessible counselling and personal support services including emergency relief, to families and individuals.

This year MCF continued to support Anglicare's Low-Cost Food Centre in Mackay with a \$7,500 grant. This initiative is a community partnership designed to stretch the available emergency relief funding in the region so that those who are disadvantaged have access to affordable, healthy food choices and has been much needed in our community.



#### **RUN FOR MI LIFE LTD**

Run for MI Life is a grass roots, Mackay based charity. Its primary purpose is to make our regional towns suicide safe and to eradicate the stigma surrounding suicide. They do this by raising funds to deliver education and training programs that teach participants how to recognise the signs that someone is suicidal and guide them to an appropriate source of help. They attend as many local events as they can to promote their activities and to show the community that there is help and support available. Through their "Be Kind" message they are urging Mackay locals to reconnect with each other and have conversations about their mental health. Their firm belief is that by talking about suicide, we can drastically reduce suicide. Suicide is a huge problem in Australia and in Mackay.

Their "Suicide Prevention education- Building momentum, Breaking down Gender barriers" project is a partnership with the GRAPEVINE group. Aims and Objectives of the project are:

- < To reduce the incidence of suicide deaths in the Mackay region,
- < To build relationships with, and work in partnership with local groups and organisations who will benefit from suicide awareness and intervention training - for example Mackay sporting groups and local businesses,
- < To provide Grapevine with the resources to be able to undertake SAFETALK training for people within these groups over the next 12 months, and
- < To provide Grapevine with the resources to be able to undertake ASIST training to the coaches, leaders, supervisors and other members of these groups who have been identified as most likely to be in a position where their advice and mentorship is sought, and who are willing and able to provide support and guidance where suicidal behaviours are evident.
- < To train at least one male person to become an ASIST trainer for the Mackay region

Mackay Community Foundation has contributed \$10,000 to enable this regional project. \_\_\_\_\_

#### **YIRS - ONE STOP YOUTH** SHOP

MCF supported Mackay Alternative Learning School with funding which allowed four year 12 Students to complete their senior year of school.

The funding also allowed for the purchase of four robotic sets and a counting system. This funding is essential in giving disengaged young people the opportunity to complete their education in a safe and supported environment. MCF provided \$16,000 to the project.

#### **REGIONAL SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT COALITION** (AUSPICED THROUGH GEORGE STREET **NEIGHBOURHOOD CENTRE)**

Regional Social Development Coalition (RSDC) has been working in regional Community Development and Social Planning throughout Whitsunday-Isaac-Mackay region for over 40 years. RSDC is currently working on a project-to-project basis through funding obtained from both private (such as Mackay Community Foundation) as well as Government sources. RSDC works closely with all three Regional Local Governments.

Because of our regional linkages, we are a regional voice with State and National lead organisations including Volunteering Queensland, QCOSS, Coalition of Community Boards QLD, Community Services Industry Alliance and QShelter. RSDC works holistically, and believes that all development should consider the community, social, political, cultural, economic and physical elements.

RSDC's "Youth Unmet Needs" is a staged research project aimed to identify current services gaps and shortfalls, particularly by working directly with disadvantaged young people and those services who are at that coalface. Additionally, the project aims to build collaborative relationships amongst service providers to foster more coordinated, seamless and holistic support to our Young People.

Mackay Community Foundation has contributed \$10.000 to the research project.



#### **KALYAN YOUTH SERVICE INC.**

Kalyan has been working with the young people of Mackay for the past 32 years in a variety of ways, and for the last 10 years has provided crisis accommodation for young people who are homeless, or at risk of homelessness, through Kalyan House, a purpose-built housing shelter leased through Qld Government Department of Housing & Public Works. Kalyan also offers transitional housing and all residents are assisted through an individual intensive case management model which is designed to build independent living skills, life, social, and recreational skills.

Kalyan was the successful applicant for the new one-off pilot program with their "Live Well" program, supporting young people aged 16 to 25 years who are homeless, or at risk of homelessness, to live independently and sustainably in stable accommodation. The "Live Well" program builds capacity through building life skills, employment skills, social & recreational skills.

#### The program aims to provide a flexible and targeted support program for those young people transitioning from home or crisis accommodation into sustainable tenancies.

MCF has provided \$14,000 in this financial year for the program to continue operation from the successful trial operated last year. Kalyan Management Committee has recently entered into discussion with the funding body with a view to securing a future funding arrangement. Data and evidence gathered to date from the Live Well program indicates a strong unmet need for this support to young people.

#### MACKAY COMMUNITY VISITORS ASSOCIATION INC.

Mackay Community Visitors Association (MCVA) is a notfor-profit organisation funded through both State and Federal Governments to support and assist people aged over 65 years and younger people with a physical and/or psychological disability and residents of aged care facilities. Their service areas include Mackay, Sarina, Pioneer Valley, Proserpine and Bowen. MCVA promotes inclusion, participation and friendship to people who are experiencing loneliness and social isolation, whether living in aged care facilities or still in their own homes. Visitors and their friends do a variety of activities including going shopping, having coffee or lunch out, going for short drives, visiting the Library or Art Space, or simply dropping by for a cuppa and a chat.

MCVA applied for funds to go towards a new transport vehicle with wheelchair access which greatly increased their capacity to support a greater number of local residents with such activities.

Mackay Community Foundation has contributed \$15,000 to enable the purchase of this new vehicle.

### NAMED FUNDS

The Mackay Community Foundation makes it easy for organisations, individuals or families to support community projects in their area by establishing a Named Fund.

A donation is invested with other trust funds, but grants made from the donation are acknowledged as being made from the Named Fund. The original donation is never spent but keeps on giving to the community long after the money or asset was donated.

A Named Fund is ideally suited to an individual, family or business wishing to provide support to a range of charities and community groups in Mackay, leave an ongoing legacy to the community, or honour a family member, friend or outstanding citizen.

They are an alternative to Private Ancillary Funds (PAF) offering some very real benefits to the donor.

- < Funds are referenced and acknowledged in the name specified by the donor. This can be an individual, partners, family names, a business name or in the memory of someone.
- < The fund is named from the outset, although the initial minimum contribution can be made over a period of years.\*
- < The donor can participate in the fund as little or as much as they desire.
- < Ongoing contributions, whilst not essential, are recommended at least for a few years.
- < Donations to the fund are tax deductible.
- < Named fund donors can be involved in presenting grants from the fund if they wish.
- < The fund continues into perpetuity, even after the donor's passing.

Donors may indicate a preference that a particular group or type of eligible projects benefit from its

donation. By establishing a Named Fund with The Mackay Community Foundation donors are ensuring that the local community will receive perpetuity grants from their fund, rather than a once off donation.
