

Donations are retained as capital by The Foundation to build a perpetual and sustainable fund for philanthropic purposes. The income earned from the capital is used to make annual community grants to appropriate Not For Profit organisations in the region that apply for grants for charitable projects that fit within the aims of The MCF.

The MCF has been endorsed by the Australian Tax Office as a charity and the Queensland Office of Fair Trading as fundraising for a charitable purpose. Donations to The Foundation are tax deductible and The Foundation is exempt from tax.

The MCF is governed by a volunteer Board of Directors, with a wide range of skills, experience and an extensive knowledge of the community.

On behalf of the board of the Mackay Community Foundation (MCF) I am honoured to present our 2014/2015 annual report. This document is more than a report though; it is in many ways, a chronicle of the generosity of our community, and a tribute to the incredible people and organisations that stand in the gap for our region's most needy.

The major aim of the Mackay Community Foundation is to build a community that is motivated to 'Give Where We Live'. We live in this beautiful region, raise our families, succeed in our business's, benefit by working in a relatively strong economy and build lifelong friendships and memories. Along the way we think it is also our duty to provide support to those who are struggling not just now but for future generations.

This year the Mackay Community Foundation reached our first significant milestone of reaching \$1million in our corpus. Our philosophy is to invest all funds raised in perpetuity, and allocate the growing fund earnings each year to grassroots community organisations that assist the needlest in our region. Our ultimate aim is to have \$10 million invested, which at that point will give us around \$600,000 to distribute each year and growing for future years.



Since our establishment in 2003 we have distributed 53 grants to local community groups and charities since inception.

The Mackay Community Foundation is a member of Philanthropy Australia and is one of 36 community foundations across Australia, linked by similar values, ethics and intent and each playing a vital role in their own community providing grassroots support at a local level.

The Foundation provides support to local community groups and charities in the Mackay region north to Proserpine and Airlie Beach, west to Moranbah, Dysart and Clermont and south to Sarina which is an area encompassing a population of approximately 150,000 people.

The Mackay Community Foundation managed the 2008 Mackay Flood Appeal, upon request of the then Mackay City Council, raising \$564,566.13 that was distributed directly to Mackay people impacted by this natural disaster.

The Foundation works extremely hard to ensure administrative expenses are kept to a minimum and where possible source donated services and support. Fifteen percent of each dollar donated to the Foundation is directed the administration account to assist with the costs associated with enabling the Foundation to deliver its mission:

It has been another very successful year for our Mackay Community Foundation (MCF) Grants program with a growing profile of the Program and increasing awareness about what our Grants can provide to our Mackay community.

For the first time in 2015 MCF was able to increase the Grant amount to \$10,000, up from \$3000 in previous years. It was felt by the Grants Committee that this would allow organisation to look at actual program development and capacity building within their target groups, rather than our grants being used to purchase or replace small equipment or one-off items. This year while there were successful applications for equipment, we also had several program based projects successfully funded.

The MCF Grants program provides funds to help, aid, provide relief or support people in distress in Mackay and surrounding districts. We do this by working with eligible organisations that primarily offer community education, care services, housing or personal support services, through a grant application process. In 2015 MCF provided a total of \$43,502 to our successful organisations who come from the youth, disability, seniors, homelessness and general community support sectors.

Grants

All Abilities Mackay Inc

MCF provided All Abilities with \$7800 for a Dementia Music Therapy program to be delivered at Northview Aged Care and St Francis of Assissi, using a qualified Music Therapist and volunteers, which aims to improve participation, individual engagement, social interaction and memory function amongst the participants.

Anglicare Nth Qld (Mackay)

Anglicare Nth Qld, Mackay branch, provides without discrimination, a range of affordable and accessible counselling and personal support services including emergency relief, to families and individuals. This year MCF provided Anglicare in Mackay with \$5000 for their Emergency Care program to enable them to continue to deliver their much needed services in our Mackay community.

Community Accommodation and Support Association Inc. (CASA)

CASA have been successful in gaining a grant of \$2000 for the "Christmas is for Everyone" Drop-In Centre which will be operated by volunteers between 24/12/2015 – 1/1/2016 to provide a welcoming space and a friendly face to those who may otherwise be alone at this time of the year.

George Street Neighbourhood Centre Association Inc. (GSNC)

GSNC was successful in receiving a grant to go towards their Transportation program. Internal research had identified the lack of transport as a major barrier for participants in being able to attend or continue to attend programs at the centre, given the very limited availability & cost of transport options. MCF has provided \$6632 to assist GSNC in continuing to offer their mini-bus transport program to our community.

Northern Australia Primary Health Ltd (trading as Headspace)

MCF has provided \$2240 in funding for Headspace Mackay to deliver the "Y Bloom" project to year 9 girls in Term 3 & 4 2015. This project aims to develop life skills of the students and to provide relevant meaningful career guidance to ensure participants have the best chance of making an informed decision about their career aspirations.

HTM Community Transport Inc.

HTM's successful application in 2015 was for \$9000 to fund the "HTM Happy Hour" program providing clients with a weekly social outing which includes a drive to a surprise destination for a meal & social interaction with others. This promotes independence & helps prevent social isolation.

Kalyan Youth Service Inc.

MCF has provided \$9680 towards the "Kalyan Outdoors" program, which will provide a hard court for handball, basketball & general outdoor fun. It will be part of a planned "backyard" development which incorporates a productive garden, outdoor seating and recreational space, the aim being to encourage the young residents to be active, to develop hobby skills and to be able to interact with others through recreational activities..

Mackay Advocacy inc.

MCF has provided \$4062 to Mackay Advocacy to allow for replacement of their computing systems to allow them to continue with their challenging and complex work.

All successful organisations were invited to our Annual Grants presentation in May 2015 which was held at "Charlies Cafe" in Porters Hardware and Homeware. Mackay Community Foundation acknowledges the great support provided to it by that company and congratulates all successful applicants. We look forward to seeing the impacts of those projects in our community where we live and give.

Our 2015 Back to School program was an outstanding success once again with \$35,000 of \$50 vouchers distributed to families to help with the cost of getting their children the appropriate resources and uniforms to attend School this year. This year through the generous donation of \$5,000 from Dalrymple Bay Coal Terminal we were able to introduce school uniforms whereas in the years gone by only stationary supplies were available. Special thanks to Carrols Newsagency and uniform solutions in making the program a success this year.

Our community foundation is different from most other charitable organisations. The initial donation/gift you make becomes the capital and the funds are invested with an emphasis on security and under the guidance of professional investment advisers. The income earned from investing donations is distributed to the Mackay community now, and the capital fund will continue to grow over the generations to come generating a growing income to distribute to our regions less fortunate forever.

Donating Options

Donors are able to make their donation in a number of ways depending on their wishes:

General Donation

All donations are tax deductible and invested in the capital fund that will continue to support the foundation giving back to the community for years to come.

Named Fund

Create a legacy for an individual, family or business by establishing a Named Fund that will support the local community for generations to come. (As an example Paul and Lyn Maguire made a significant donation to the local community and established the Maquire & Dumma Fund). See our donors page for more named funds.

Honouring the Past – Securing the Future

This program is an exciting fundraising campaign which not only secures funds for the future. The program also provides an opportunity to celebrate those who have made a significant contribution to our community in the past by honouring they story. Only 150 people will be honoured. The required donation is \$2,300.

Bequests

People can make a donation as a bequest in their Will. The bequest can be recognised by name if the donor wishes or it can be an anonymous gift. Please contact The Foundation to discuss the instructions you need to include in your Will.

A simple, yet highly active means for businesses and employees to together make an ongoing valuable contribution to the community.



The Mackay Foundation makes it easy for organisations, individuals or families to support community projects in their area by establishing a Named Fund.

A donation is invested with other trust funds but grants made from the donation are acknowledged as being made from the Named Fund. The original donation is never spent, but keeps on giving to the community long after the money or asset was donated.

A Named Fund is ideally suited to an individual, family or business wishing to provide support to a range of charities and community groups in Mackay, leave an ongoing legacy to the community, or honour a family member, friend or outstanding citizen.

They are an alternative to Private Ancillary Funds (PAF) offering some very real benefits to the donor.

- Funds are referenced and acknowledged in the name specified by the donor. This can be an individual, partners, family names, a business name or in the memory of someone.
- The fund is named from the outset, although the initial minimum contribution can be made over a period of years.*

- The donor can participate in the fund as little or as much as they desire.
- Ongoing contributions, whilst not essential, are recommended at least for a few years.
- Donations to the fund are tax deductible.
- Named fund donors are able to be involved in presenting grants from the fund if they wish.
- The fund continues into perpetuity, even after the donor's passing.

Donors may indicate a preference that a particular group or type of eligible projects benefit from its donation. By establishing a Named Fund with The Mackay Foundation donors are ensuring that the local community will receive perpetuity grants from their fund, rather than a once off donation.

We are happy to discuss this or any other options with you, confidentially and totally obligation free.

* The minimum contribution is \$11,500 over three years, and includes a 15% fee for administration.
